Driving is a privilege, NOT a constitutional right! People obtain driver's licenses based on the skills they have, agreeing to follow the rules of the road, and demonstrating the ability to drive safely. Illinois laws are meant to protect everyone on the roadways while still granting the freedom to drive if the driver is legally able. No one has more rights on the road than anyone else and this includes people with disabilities.

In order for a person with a disability to drive, their car usually has to be altered to fit the needs of the individual who will be driving it. All modifications must comply with all federal and environmental laws and should be modified by an authorized agency.

Adapted vehicles allow people with disabilities to drive with improved safety and comfort, but some of these systems can be very pricey. This is where Disability Resource Center's Assistive Technology for Children's Program helped our consumer Danielle and her family.

Danielle was born with Spina Bifida and is paralyzed from the waist down. Danielle, like all 16-year-olds, was excited about gaining her independence thru driving. Even though her grandmother donated her car, with Danielle's disability and the cost of a modified vehicle, Danielle's family was unsure if this dream would ever be a reality. Danielle's family found DRC.

The Assistive Technology for Children's Program is funded through United Way of Will & United Way of Grundy Counties and thru generous donations from local businesses and families around our service area. The program services children with disabilities up to the age of 23 and allows DRC to help families like Danielle's up to \$600. Danielle's family was able to put this money towards having Danielle's car modified with hand and speed controls which allowed this excited teenager to finally be able to drive on her own!!

Danielle's family couldn't be happier, well not happier than Danielle that is! Danielle has gained the independence that she never thought she would have been able to obtain. Danielle and her mom drove to DRC and showed off her newly modified vehicle. We all celebrated, took pictures, and had moments of happy tears.

S.K.I.L.L.S. PROGRAM (SHARING KEY INDEPENDENT LIFE LESSONS)

Our goal is to assist people with disabilities gain more confidence in their everyday life. Starting July 1, 2022 we taught over sixty-three (63) consumers topics such as Money Management, Personal Relationships, Job Interviewing Skills, Pubic Transportation, Housing, and Driving Tools, etc.

We teach these classes to students 18-22 years old that are in a Transitional School within the Will & Grundy County areas. We also have a partnership with Lewis University students majoring in Education that assist us in the program.

FAST TRACK PROGRAM

Our Fast Track Program has grown!! For the 2022-2023 fiscal year we have over sixty (60) re-enrolled consumers and over sixty-six (66) new enrollees. Students learn the Pre-Employment Transition Services of Self Advocacy, Post Secondary Education, Work Place Readiness, Work Based Learning, and Job Exploration Counseling. The Fast Track Program is taught in a class room environment and will compliment your child's school curriculum.

ITAC (ILLINOIS TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACCESS CORP)



From January 2022 to date, DRC had over one hundred and fifty (150) people obtain a free amplified phone.

What does this mean? DRC has helped more Illinois residents with hearing loss obtain free amplified telephones, cell phones, and answering machines than any other selection center in the state. Out of the 28 selection centers, **DRC is still in 1st place!**

The ITAC program provides FREE amplified telephones and other equipment to all allow Illinois residents with qualified hearing loss regain the ability to hear on the phone. DRC is an official "selection center" for ITAC. Consumers can call to make an appointment to test different types of amplified phone equipment to find the one that best suits their needs.

DRC's consumer D. received an iPad to help him communicate on his own. D. is now ordering his own meals when he goes out to eat with his family. D.'s family will continue to add words and categories to the (Touch Chat App) to help him continue to be more independent.



With United Way Funding and private donations to our Assistive Technology for Children's Program, we were able to approve an AT application for D.R., a one-year old boy who has a visual impairment. The letter from his therapist requested an iPad to assist him with engaging in educational applications and increase his learning. Not only will the iPad increase D.R.'s learning, but there are applications that can help navigate his surroundings to ensure his safety when he is at his home; as well as in the community as he grows older.

HIGHLIGHTS (7/1/22 - PRESENT)

Community Reintegration Program: DRC has had one (1) successful move out since July 2022.

DMD (Disability Mentoring Day): DMD Day is a nationwide effort to promote career development for students with disabilities thru hands on career exploration. Thank you to the following businesses for allowing twenty-seven (27) Lockport HS students visit on DMD day: CW Avery Family YMCA, Joliet Slammers, Lockport Police Department, Plainfield Park District PARC and Home2Suites Hilton in Joliet.

Fast Track: One hundred and fourteen (114) students were approved thru DRS to participate in our Fast Track program.

Voting: Two (2) students from Plainfield voted at the County Clerks Office.

Housing Vouchers: DRC obtained twenty-two (22) housing vouchers which helped 58 people and their families get placed into housing.

Peer Counseling: Men's Group had over twenty (20) Participants, Women's Group had over ten (10) participants, and Teen Talk over six (6) participants.
